TORAH



Jesus and His Unshakeable Connection to The Jewish Scriptures

"And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us..." (John 1:14, KJV).

"On the one hand <u>he strengthened the Torah</u> of Moses majestically...and <u>not one</u> of our Sages spoke out more emphatically concerning the immutability of the Torah."

(25 prominent rabbis from Israel and abroad, Israel Today, January 2020)

Jesus gave the Torah (what Christians call the "Old" Testament) more power when He proclaimed that not even the smallest letter would pass away until its purpose is complete. "...verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled" (Matthew 5:18). Jesus also said whoever tries to weaken even one of the smallest commandments (in the "Old" Testament) will be the least-esteemed and regarded as small in the Kingdom (Matthew 5:19). Have Christians perhaps misread and maybe even mischaracterized His relationship with the Hebrew Scriptures? If the Torah is dead and no longer applicable then why did Jesus stand up and teach it and why does He, as King, read it to the nations as prophesied in Isaiah 2:3? The Church continues to lav aside the

very commandments which God said, "...would never pass away" (Matthew 24:35). The conclusion of the matter is that the controversy Jesus had with His religious friends was to "show how best to observe the Law, but none, it is argued, about whether to observe it....Jesus was a staunch defender of the Torah against what He perceived to be threats to it from the Pharisees." (Jewish Gospels, Rabbi Daniel Boyarin).

The word "immutability" used by the rabbis in the above quote shows that God is unchanging in His Character, Will, and Covenant Promises from Genesis to Malachi. Also, what is written from Matthew to Revelation—is "written." If every Bible in the world were destroyed, it would not change God's Everlasting Words. Sadly, there is

a famine of the Word in many churches. "Behold, the days are coming," says the Lord GOD, "That I will send a famine on the land, Not a famine of bread, Nor a thirst for water, But of hearing the words of the LORD" (Amos 8:11). Sermons filled with the "meat" of God's Word are rare from today's pulpits and often leave the sheep hungry when they depart. The Torah was always in the Heart of Jesus. If one throws out the Torah, they are throwing the Lord's Words away as He was and is the "Living Torah." It was the basis for His answers, and His questions to others. The New Testament is built firmly upon the "Old" Testament.

Jesus will Deliver the Torah

While attending church camp in my youth, we would hear the early morning bugle, indicating it was time to rise and pledge allegiance to the American flag and then attend prayer services. May this message bear the sound of allegiance to God's Words and present a call to arms to read the whole Counsel of God. If Jesus loved the Torah so much, if He taught only from the Hebrew Scriptures at the time, He was alive on earth, and if Jesus was and is the "Living Torah" made flesh, then why have Christians been taught to ignore it? It's time to blow the bugle and wake everyone up!

I read recently of a Christian speaking to his neighbor. "My priest told me the Old Testament is no longer relevant, and, as Christians, we only need to read the New Testament. So I don't base anything on the Old Testament." With hardly a thought, the Old Testament was dismissed as ancient and outdated information. (Story from Friends of Israel, www.foi.org). How sad but this is just the tip of the iceberg.

Speaking of icebergs, they are usually a small part of a much bigger problem period. A famous ship (the Titanic) once sank because it ignored an iceberg. The "Church" has hit an iceberg when it comes to its "missing link" (Israel) and the ignorance of the Torah is shocking to our Jewish friends who are surprised at how little Christians know about God's Words from the whole Bible! They find it difficult to believe that Christians would read only the New Testament and leave out the foundation upon which it stands. It is easy to see Christians have been "programmed" by Church Fathers who believed in Replacement Theology. The end result is a generation of Christians who have been taught to forsake the Hebrew

Scriptures, fear the mention of it, or worse yet, freeze when they hear the word "Torah!" If only in their minds, they have thrown it into the dust bin.

Time is running out. How can anyone's lamps be burning if they snuff out the Torah? Torah will always live on as the basis of the teachings of Jesus because of His Jewish background. When the Coming Kingdom is established on earth, it will be Jesus who will deliver "the Law" from Zion to the world. Jesus, as King and Messiah, will speak the words of His Father to the nations. "And many people will go and...He will teach us His Ways... Torah will go forth from Zion and the Word of Adonai from Jerusalem" (Isaiah 2:3; Micah 4:2-3). If Christians forsake Torah now, will it not sound strange coming from the lips of Messiah?

The Jewish baby Yeshua (Jesus) that was born, arrived to a Jewish world and into the home of an observant Orthodox couple (Yosef and Miriam), a/k/a Joseph and Mary in Christianity, who lived by the Torah in His childhood home. Most Christians today get as nervous as a cat on hot bricks and work themselves up into a state of extreme

nervous worry about being drawn "under the Law." Immediately they think "bondage." We are living in days similar to the days of Noah. The people of Noah's day were into every wicked way there was—including genetic alterations. God's creation is again being manipulated through AI (artificial intelligence) and God's Holy Word is being ignored. The planet on which we live is heading towards a "no boundaries for anyone—live as you please" world where lawlessness abounds. "And because lawlessness is increased, most people's love will grow cold..." (Matthew 24:12). Mankind was never meant to live without rules and guidelines.

What is termed the "Old" Testament teaches us what is "clean and unclean" and "holy" and "defiled." Paul reminds us that "Whatever things were written before were written for our learning" (Romans 15:4). Some Christians forget that "all Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). The Hebrew Psalmist clearly states "The teaching of HaShem (the Lord) is perfect...making the eyes light up" (Psalm 19:8). Where were we ever taught the deception that we don't have to study the entire Bible—but only the "New" Testament? There is absolutely no evidence anywhere to prove that Jesus ever put an end to the Jewish Scriptures...as I said at the beginning, He gave it more power by His Words.

The Lord's main contention in the New Testament was with the religious and how they interpreted God's Word from their own traditions and commentaries. He did not question the Torah. He questioned men. Those who had added to God's Words and the way in which they defined it. Christianity has also added to God's Word through creeds, dogmas and extra-Biblical traditions. We must be very careful to follow God's Word as God gave it and as it was written down on the Scrolls of ancient history.

Jesus did not come to fulfill the New Testament, He came to fulfill the Torah. (There was no New Testament at the time.) Jesus kept the Law perfectly for us, and paid the debt we owed. He can never be separated from His Father's Words in the Scrolls. Torah and the New Testament, connect in wonderful ways and confirm one another beautifully as all Scripture leads to the Father—the ultimate One True and Almighty God—and Jesus is our High Priest before God.

If the Jewish Scriptures show that Paul was still Torah observant some 25 years after his revelation of the Messiah, shouldn't it cause Christians to rethink the traditions of Church fathers who preached against the Torah? Jesus reminds us, "In everything, then, do to others as you would have them do to you. For this is the Law and the Prophets" (Matthew 7:12).

The Didache: Teachings of the Apostles

Toby Janicki creates an indispensable scholarly resource for believers in Jesus in his book "The Way of Life," the rediscovered teachings of the twelve Jewish apostles to the Gentiles called the Didache. Jewish believers in Jesus maintain that neither Yeshua nor His first followers envisioned a separate and distinct faith movement outside of, or disconnected from, the Judaism of Jesus. They never started a new religion, but rather, understood themselves as a sect within the Jewish community.


Faithful to the Torah, the early Jewish believers were loyal to Yeshua the Nazarene and proclaimed His message of repentance and the Coming Kingdom announced by the prophets. From the Didache, we learn that the early believing community had visiting teachers, and it asserts that those who supported and upheld the Torah "should be received as from the Lord." Noel Rabinowitz, Ph.D., Professor of Biblical Studies, Israel Study Center suggests, "It will make some cringe to suggest that the early church (ekklesia) embraced Torah obedience as the benchmark of ethical behavior." But today we look at truth, and not that which we've been taught by clerics and church forefathers in the past who had no revelation at all about their Hebraic foundations.

In the Kingdom to come on earth, religion will not rule. The King will reign and deliver the Holy Scriptures as His Father wants it them to be delivered. It will "go forth" to the nations, and He alone will deliver it—not rabbis, not scribes, not pastors—as the King of all Kings tabernacles among mankind. Won't it be wonderful to spend an eternity learning the height, width, breadth and length of the love of God found in His Everlasting Words and to learn to cherish those Words? Let's remember it was God's Word in the Jewish Scriptures that resurrected a nearly dead nation when all hope was lost! The words came alive and brought the People of Israel back to life! Church in the nations!

Do we really want to throw those Eternal Words of God "in the dust bin" or continue to disregard them because we are afraid of "coming under the law?" We need to rid our people of this fear. Granted, Israel still cannot see Jesus; however, let us not in arrogance and spiritual pride continue to feel that they are spiritually dead, for they are far from it. Along with the return to Israel has come a deep searching of understanding God and His Words.

All Scripture is Divinely Inspired

In a previous issue of *For Zion Sake*, I wrote about Paul always calling for his Torah Scrolls (on parchments in ancient times) when he was on



his journeys. (You can view that issue by visiting the CFI website).* He let everyone know that he could not do without them! "Bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas when you come—and the books, especially the parchment" (2 Timothy 4:13). If this be the case for Paul, then how can the Church ignore 77% of the Bible? There are 283 direct quotations from the Hebrew Scriptures in the New Testament. In the American Standard Version of the Bible, the words "It is written" appears 913 times—the Revised Standard Version 924 times and in Young's Literal Translation 971 times.

We must always remember that "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). Jesus said, "What I teach is not mine, but belongs to Him that sent me" (John 7:16). While the Torah itself cannot make one perfect before God, our High Priest modified it but did not abolish it; therefore, its principles, ethic and moral codes, what is "clean and unclean" stand as unchangeable according to the Master.

Do you know of someone who might be thirsty for living water but will not read the "Old" Testament? Why not begin to pray that the whole counsel of God might open up as it happened to the disciples of Jesus while walking on the dusty roads of Israel as recorded in **Luke 24:15-32**. For many, once we took a sip from the wells of Jacob, the very words Our Lord Jesus drank from daily and lived out, only made us become more thirsty to study deeper both the Torah along with the New Testament.

I agree with the rabbis—no one has ever spoken about the ageless and permanent immutability of the Old Testament like Jesus.

Helping with emergency medical supplies

The preceding months have in most every way taught us to reconsider, reevaluate, adjust our thinking, and even limit our activities and way of life. However, our purpose, responsibilities and mission in the midst of a global pandemic should be unwavering as with the mission of the Israel Defense Forces, who stand undeterred to fulfil its mission to protect the State of Israel.

The global outbreak of COVID-19 has left many people in a heightened state of vulnerability. The IDF took part in numerous initiatives exhibiting dedication to its mission; A Nationwide food distribution operation to assist Israel's elderly, an Intelligence Unit assisted the Ministry of Health to find innovative solutions to medical challenges. They adapted the BiPAP home ventilating device to monitor air pressure and filter pollution in COVID-19 patient rooms, and facilitated the manufacturing up to 1000 protective masks a day for medical teams. IDF teams developed special shields and air conditioning systems in ambulances, to enable driver's safety. IDF technicians created information management software for the testing labs. The IDF Weapons Manufacturing Center was converted to produce protective

goggles and spray guns for sanitizing purposes. And a Naval Commando Unit converted pressure cylinders to develop methods of compressing medical oxygen. During unique times when the mission of protecting its citizens calls, the IDF is fulfilling their mission and answering the call to serve.

CFI Ready to Help

CFI and Outreach Project David's Shield stand ready to serve in solidarity with the efforts of the brave defenders of Israel. We encourage them at every opportunity that they are not only fulfilling their mission as IDF soldiers and Border Police in an admirable way, but also fulfilling the very words of God spoken through Isaiah "The Lord will have compassion on Jacob; once again he will choose Israel and will settle them in their own land. Aliens will join them and unite with the house of Jacob" (Isaiah 14:1 NIV).

Recent contributions to the efforts of Lone Soldier Center activities, permitted otherwise restricted visits with soldiers in remote positions, plus the continued support of special units, with needed items allowed for CFI Jerusalem and the goals of David's Shield Outreach to be fulfilled. 



Just before our city went into the home isolation mode, Hope for the Future had other application for assistance waiting to be processed, such as students in their last year of college reaching out to us for help. Public Transportation running on a compressed schedule, I met with the recipient in open spaces, being the hands and feet of the Lord! Most certainly, we were not given a spirit of fear but love and a sound mind. If someone would ask what does love looks like, I would say by demonstration! Safeguarding and Preserving the Children

Throughout the history of Israel and since their beginnings, the lives of the Jewish People have been threatened attempting to stop the Purpose of God, not only for this nation but for the restoration of all mankind. The strategy, even all through the Bible has been the same: The killing of children. During the Holocaust, the Jewish People were vulnerable to persecution and horrifically 1.5 million Jewish children were murdered or died at the hands of Nazi officials and collaborators. Jewish youngsters were targeted solely on racial grounds. Children and pregnant women had the lowest rate of survival in concentration camps and were immediately sent to the gas chambers at Auschwitz-Birkenau and other killing centers. Thousands survived only because they were hidden, with identities disguised, and often physically concealed from the outside world, constantly facing fear, dilemmas and danger.

Today, CFI and Streams of Blessing project, together with the Jewish community here in Israel, are blessing children all over the Land. Please meet some of them and help us with your support and prayers:

At two months of age, Roman was diagnosed with terminal failure in his heart, and given little chance to survive. A surgery at The Chaim Sheba Medical Center in Tel Aviv was a success and it was a blessing to see him discharged and dressed up with CFI donations of clothes. We now enjoy a new found friendship with this beautiful family.

Dvash and Emunah are children living and growing up in the Judean Mountains. This is a

wonderful experience to partner with their families who made *Aliyah* years ago and settled in the heartland of Israel. Their parents served as combat soldiers with the IDF and are back to possess the Land that God promised. They open the doors of their Farm for Christians and Jews to come and pray and study the Torah together. Another precious relationship being formed.

Ohr Simcha is an Israeli nonprofit organization we support which helps rescue and educate Jewish children facing abandonment or domestic abuse. CFI has destined funds for school supplies, food, clothes, medicine, infrastructure, construction and furniture. We're making a difference in the lives of many. Thank you for the support coming from the nations as we are fighting the good battle of faith together with these little warriors to help them reach their destiny. caust survivors our friends, or even more precious, that they would consider us as friends. We often get letters of thanks, kind words from our survivors, and phone calls asking for us to come visit soon. However, when we receive letters like the one below, how our hearts melt with humble gratitude and sweet love, in realizing we are truly friends of some of God's most precious people.

Our survivor, Hanna from Lod, writes...

Dear Christian Friends of Israel,

My name is Hanna. I was born in 1939 and I am a Holocaust survivor. With all of my heart I would like to thank you for your ongoing work of caring, loving and supporting people like me who survived the Holocaust.

In 1998 my husband, my mother and I immigrated to Israel on a ship called "Dmitry Shestokovich." It was when I was aboard this ship that I first heard about the organization, "Christian Friends of Israel." We were told that the people who worked for them had open and generous hearts, and would do anything they could to help us. This turned out to be absolutely true! I will never forget my first meeting with Sharon Sanders in Jerusalem, and her visit to us in Lod shortly after. Sharon came to visit my mother, who was also a Holocaust survivor! What a wonderful day it was! The visit was long and we spoke about everything! The warmth of Sharon's heart brought my mother back to life, strengthened her and encouraged her for life in a new land so full of giants and challenges. The highlight of that day were the Yiddish songs that Sharon sang to my precious mother!

In 1999 a group of the Holocaust survivors established an organization for the survivors in Lod. It was called, "Impossible to Forget." Since the very beginning your organization showered us with attention and support. We had many precious and heartwarming meetings, both in Jerusalem and in Lod.

Now this work has been continued by Olga and Tanya. They help us to organize beautiful events, and always bring gifts, but most importantly they are unreserved in pouring out their love and joy. Their smiles are so contagious, that we cannot help but smile back. We even feel younger when we are with them. We so appreciate the home visits they make to those who are not able to get out any more, always bringing them gifts and much needed comfort.

Dear Olga and Tanya, what a lovely time we had together on our last meeting for Women's Day! You both are such a joy to us all! Thank you so much for remembering us and creating so many unforgettable memories! I would like to thank you all for your sincere hearts and for your desire to do everything possible for people like myself in helping us to live full and happy lives here in the Land. I want to wish you all good health and fulfillment of your heart's desires. May you always be young in your hearts and successful in everything you do.

This includes having an undivided family unit and governmental stipends specific for them to make the transition to Israel.

We were able to help them obtain a washer, dryer, refrigerator, microwave and stove in order to accommodate these brave men who are determined to move into God's intention for their destiny. We are able to encourage these and others who are our brothers and sisters in Jesus by your consistent stand with us.



During the Six-Day War in 1967

Israel recaptured territory that includes East Jerusalem and Judea and Samaria the ancient and heartland of Biblical Israel which the world wrongfully calls the "West bank" or "occupied territories." Today most of the Israelis living in Judea and Samaria are religious Zionists. They believe that "Eretz Yisrael" (the Land of Israel) is given to the forefathers of Jewish people promised by God, and they have the obligation to resettle in their homeland and defend this Land in ways that comport with the Torah's high standards of justice. Accompanied by Torah studies, their boys serve in the army and girls in national service.

The dedicated residents in the ancient Biblical heartland of Israel are Israel's front-line defence against terrorism. They face danger and death constantly, battling brave terror attacks carried out by extreme Palestinian terrorist via bomb explosions, stabbings, firebomb attacks, shooting attacks and kidnapping — all leaving a trail of death and destruction. A terror attack occurs within minutes, but it changes life forever. Many of their lives are turned upside down, what was, is no longer, and

people are left to bear the physical and emotional scars for the rest of their lives

What a great faith in God they exhibit.

Because of covid restrictions in our Distribution Center CFI is taking this opportunity to enlarge our vision for those coming home to Israel. Their first days are so important. You don't have breakfast without toast (therefore they need a toaster), one doesn't bake a cake without a mixer (therefore mixers are valuable for food preparation), a newcomer needs to wash clothes sometimes for a large family weekly or even daily (therefore washing machines are needed), food needs to be refrigerated (refrigerators are needed). Along with these appliances come irons for clothing, dryers for drying the garments as well as towels.

Christian Friends of Israel is working to ease the early days of new immigrants through our Distribution Center which remains open to the public but with fewer guests than usual because of the Corona virus regulations of "distancing." We have also begun a new phase of *Aliyah* Assistance. It takes all of us working together, Jews and Christians, to try to meet urgent needs. Moving to a new Land during the midst of a pandemic takes courage and it is tiring and very exhausting during the summer months. Businesses have slowed down and waiting periods can sometimes be long. Making "*Aliyah*" is a holy thing for a Jewish family to do as they choose to come "home" making Israel their "safe haven" for life.

These are the sons and daughters (and children) whose parents and grandparents suffered much anti-Semitism during WW II in Europe. In the Bible we read many prophecies about God's plan to bring His people back to the Land of Israel. In the distribution center we can see the faces of these precious people in daily basis. Sometimes we hear amazing stories about God's actions in the lives of our new emigrants.

Maria and Sergei Tolkachov came from Ukraine two months ago. They have experienced something extraordinary, and they know that God is behind that all. They shared with us "the story of the yellow suitcase."

This beautiful family lived in Ukraine in the city of Lugansk. Maria's father was a Jew, and all the family knew about it. They kept some traditions in their home, too, for example during the Pesach (Passover) they ate matzah (unleavened bread). The Jewish organization of charity helped Maria's father with health problems in his last years of life. She had good contact with these Jews for many years. The same organization offered them an opportunity to study Hebrew, too.



Only the Yellow Suitcase Survived

Maria and Sergei didn't really think about moving to Israel. They were working in good places. Life was fine. Then the war began in 2014. It changed everything. Lugansk was bombed, too. One explosion took place 2 meters from Tolkachov's garage. Their car was destroyed. There were 5 suitcases on top of each other in the same garage. Everything was burned except one yellow suitcase in between the other

suitcases. It was the suitcase of Maria's father with all the documents proving their Jewry. Maria and Sergei have one son. He was the first in the family willing to make *Aliyah*. In 2015 he moved to Israel. He learned the language and now he is studying medicine in the Land. Also Maria and Sergei were approved to emigrate in the same year, but they were not ready to leave their home, work, friends and many other familiar things behind then. The situation in their home city did not get better. The war is still reality in Lugansk. That all helped them to make the decision. Maria and Sergei moved to Israel in November 2019. At the moment they live with their son in Ramat Gan.

Mentally it wasn't easy to emigrate and the process of moving wasn't without challenges either. Maria and Sergei had to pass the border between East and West Ukraine. They needed to travel by bus and then they took the train to Kiev. The family got help from different organizations during the whole process of *Aliyah*. Christian friends hosted them in Kiev before their flight to Israel. The first feel in the promised Land was not so wonderful. Everything was different: the language, mentality, climate, houses... everything! "The best thing here are the people," Maria and Sergei say. "People that you don't know try to help you in different ways and they are friendly."

The plans for the future are: being together as a family, working and travelling. "We want to help our son and travel as much as possible." Sergei says. He himself was born in a little town in Siberia. "Maybe in the future we can visit that region, too." Maria and Sergei are amazed the willingness of Christian to help them. "God unites us." "The good that you are doing will come back to you as a boomerang." Maria confirms. May the Lord help us to do more good deeds for His glory!































Serve God Now and Beyond the Virus

I stumbled upon a little book we obtained from Christ for the Nations Bible college in Dallas, Texas, where both Ray and I went to Bible college. The book written by Pastor Wayne Meyers once again stirred me to the point that I felt "we really do not know what it is to give and to live giving lives as "prosperity is not measured by what we have but by what we give." We either give with a spoon or with a shovel, these are God's measures. Brother Meyers said "money is not basically our problem. Our problem is the heart. When we love God more than we love things, then we will automatically lay all we have on the altar. How much do you want to receive from God? God determines the size of our gift in proportion to the sacrifice that accompanies it." (from his book "Living Beyond the Possible).

I felt led of the Lord to tell of his story to Tepeapulco, Hidalgo, Mexico, as it is not only incredible, but it is true. We have lived a life of tithing, giving generously and receiving miracles beyond our wildest imaginations and hope to give of our lives to God as long as we live in order to fully surrender it all. I would like to share "Part I" with you all and perhaps it will speak to your heart the way it has mine and is spurring me on to give generously wherever and whenever I can. May you all be blessed. This is not a plea for funds or money, it is a lifestyle, a Biblical principal and a chance to read what others have done. Enjoy.

"The Christians in Tepeapulco, Hidalgo, Mexico had one of those problems that every pastor hopes for: the church had grown so much they needed a larger building. In order to avoid the red tape in getting another building permit from the government, they simply put new walls around the original church. Their plan was simple—when they put the new roof on, they would tear down the inside building.

The problem was the roof. These Christians had used all of their faith and funds to get the walls up. How could they put on the roof—the most expensive part of the building—without funds? "Brother Myers, I know that God uses you to inspire faith for finances," the pastor wrote me. "Would you come and minister at our church?" I gladly agreed and drove the three hours from



Mexico City, anticipating ministering to the people and raising the funds for the church roof. I had seen it happen all over Mexico and had no doubt that God would do it again in Tepeapulco.

That is, until I arrived.

I drove over to the pastor's home before the evening service, "Brother Myers, thank you for coming," he greeted me. "But I need to tell you that we have no money at all. We just bought musical instruments for the church orchestra, and the entire congregation has used all its resources. I'm sorry, but I don't think there's anything you can do for us tonight."

I excused myself and went to the church to pray. "Lord, I drove three hours to help these people," I began my complaint. "Have I wasted my time?" I was disgusted and discouraged and obviously in no frame of mind to preach a message on faith. May own had hit bottom. "Lord, is what this pastor said true? Is there no reason for me to be here tonight?"

"On the one hand, he told you the unadulterated truth," I heard God speaking into my spirit. "There are no finances. But on the other hand, he didn't tell you all the truth. At their present level of faith, there are no funds. That's why I sent you, son. Build their faith in My Word and My Word will lift their faith to another level. At that level there will be funds to roof this building." (Watch for Part 2 in the next issue of For Zion Sake).

Israel is in dire straits. Its economy is at the lowest state for as long as anyone can remember and so are many nation's economies around the world. This might pertain to you and your country.
